The laboratory was established in the academic year 2012-13. The lab is located on the 2nd floor of the main building and has 35 computers and 40 audio headsets and an LCD projector. English Language Learning application is installed on every system. They contain modules on Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing (LSRW) skills.

These activities are held during the tutorials allotted as per the class timetable. This ensures that the activities are held in a structured manner and are conducted on all working days. For listening activities students are assigned audio-recordings and are asked to complete exercises based on these recordings. Similarly, reading material is assigned and students are asked to complete the relevant exercises. Learning levels are assigned based on their performances in the exercises. This ensures that the material caters to the learning needs of all learners coming from diverse backgrounds.

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




ABOUT THE CENTRE:




Brief Report of the event:




Physical and Mental Fitness


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

Details of the Activity


