2	Agenda 1: To discuss and approve the change in nomenclature of programmes and syllabus of Sem. I and II	
	Dr. Kannan briefed about the reason for change in nomenclature of given programme and highlighted the importance of logistics and supply chain management and also informed that Board of Studies under the leadership of Ms. Anubhuti Singh has framed the syllabus with the help of experts.	
	All members approved the change in nomenclature of Programme - B.Com. (Transport Management) to B.Com. (Logistics and supply chain management) and also the new syllabus of semester I to II of B.Com. (Logistics and supply chain management) unanimously from the Academic year 2020-21	

Agenda 2: To discuss and approve the change in syllabus of Semester 5 and 6 for all Undergraduate programmes (New Syllabus was framed from 2019-20 under Autonomy)

From Academic year 19-20, College became autonomous and all the Board of Studies of the College introduced new syllabus under autonomy. As a part of gradual progression, Third year syllabus - Semester V and VI of the following undergraduate programmes were approved unanimously.

- 1) Bachelor of Arts Semester V and VI
- 2) Bachelor of Arts Specialization: Multimedia and Mass Communication Semesters V and VI
- 3) BA Specialization: Film, Television and New Media Production Semester V and VI
- 4) Bachelor of Commerce Semesters V and VI
- 5) Bachelor of Commerce Specialization: Accounting & Finance Semester V and VI
- 6) Bachelor of Commerce Specialization: Financial Markets Semester V and VI
- 7) Bachelor of Commerce Specialization: Investment Management Semester V and VI
- 8) B.Com.(Banking and Insurance)Semester V and VI
- 9) Bachelor of Management Studies Semester V and VI
- 10) B.Com/B.M.S Environmental Management & Economics Semester V and VI
- 11) Bachelor of Commerce (Transport Management) Semester V and VI
- 12) Bachelor of Science Specialization: Information Technology Semester V and VI

Dr. Kannan briefed about the change in syllabus. Mr. Mahesh Chandarana raised query regarding change in the syllabus in comparison of syllabus of University of Mumbai and it was clarified that about 20% to 30% of the syllabus was revised. Principal also informed about the mechanism to communicate students about the change in syllabus.

Mr. Liyaquat Khan suggested incorporating/Clarifying in bracket along with syllabus of each programme that it is a Revised syllabus or new syllabus as the case may be.

Mr. Liyaquat Khan also suggested mentioning in bracket in case of B.Com. (Transport Management) the year in which syllabus introduced and also to ensure that student can appear for exam in Transport Management up to 3 Academic year's i.e.2023-24 or 5 terms.

In Second year of Autonomy, following new undergraduate programmes were introduced in 2020-21

- 3) Bachelor of Science Specialization: Data Science Semester III and IV

The syllabus of above Undergraduate programmes for semester III and IV applicable from academic year 2021-22 was approved unanimously.

Agenda 4: To discuss and approve the syllabus for semester 3 and 4 of all NEW Postgraduate programmes started in the academic session 2020-21 under Autonomy In Second year of Autonomy, following new Postgraduate programmes were introduced in 2020-21. 1. M.A. (Communication and Journalism) 2. M.A. (Applied Geography) 3. M.A. (Hindi) 4. M.Sc. (Data Science) 5. M.Sc. (Finance) The syllabus of above PG programmes for semester III and IV applicable from academic year 2021-22 was approved unanimously. However, in case of M.Sc. (Finance) revised syllabus of even semester I and II is approved separately since we are involving an external body with academic tie-up. Agenda 5: To discuss and approve new Syllabus of Sem. V and VI of 6 Paper B. A. 6 (Psychology) Programme to start from 2021-22 The new syllabus of B.A. (Psychology) programme – Semester V and VI was approved unanimously. Mr. Mahesh Chandarana asked for the details of courses under this programme which was clarified by Dr. Sonika Gupta. Agenda 6: To discuss and approve new Syllabus of Sem. I and II of new PG Programme to start from 2021-22 Syllabus of Semester I and II of M.Sc. (Artificial Intelligence) was approved unanimously. Dr. Vishesh Srivastava informed that it is going to be in partnership with TCS ION. Mr. Liyaqat Khan suggested approving the syllabus of Semester I and II only. Mr. Mahesh Chandarana suggested putting proposal in CDC regarding finalising the fees for each of the new programmes introduced from Academic year 2021. New syllabus of B.Com. (Logistics and Supply chain management) - Semester I and II was approved unanimously. 8 Agenda 7: To discuss and approve the syllabus of all curriculum enrichment and skill enhancement courses (Certificate and Diploma) to be introduced from next academic session Syllabus of new diploma programme - Diploma in Digital Marketing was approved unanimously. Syllabus of new 28 certificate courses to be introduced from academic year 2021-22 was approved unanimously. Dr. Kannan briefed about certificate courses. Mr. Dilip Tikle suggested having multiple certification programmes at various levels e.g.

Foundation, Inter-mediatory, and Advanced. He suggested changing nomenclature of few certificate courses. He also suggested that partnership with other institutions should create brand value for KES and also create market for our students.

Dr. Vaibhav explained Wealth management is in partnership with TCS ION.

Eligibility of all new programmes were approved by the house

Agenda 9: To discuss and approve the examination pattern of all new programmes

Dr. Kannan Briefed about the examination pattern that the internal exam will be held online and the marks are divided into 15 marks for assignment/practicals, 20 marks for internal exam and 5 marks for classroom conduct (Total - 40 marks) and external exam will be held for 60 marks.

Standard of passing will be 40 percent under each of the heads - internal and external separately

There will be two internal exam and the mark of the best one will be considered. The external examination will be held offline.

The house has unanimously passed the above examination pattern.

Principal has proposed new exam pattern where in students will be allowed to continue succession to higher classes even with KT till semester 6. It was decided to have a detailed discussion and it will be taken into next AC meeting.

Principal stressed on following Case study method for teaching -learning and also planning to organise workshops for the same.

Mr. Mahesh Chandarana suggested taking students interest into consideration while incorporating such changes.

Agenda 10: To discuss and approve the revision of CO, PO, PSO of programmes and Mapping methodology of CO, PO, PSO

Principal briefed about the terms CO, PO, PSO of programmes and its mapping methodology. Madam informed that if we do so, our college will be pioneer in OBE in Mumbai and particularly in Commerce faculty.

Mr. Dilip Tikle added that he has done it for foreign universities and suggested that it should be in line with Blooms' taxonomy learning levels.
